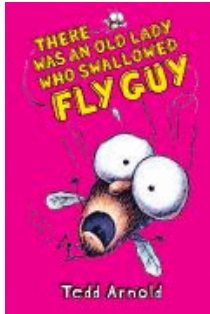

This time Cam Jansen relies on her hearing rather than her photographic memory to find a missing classmate.



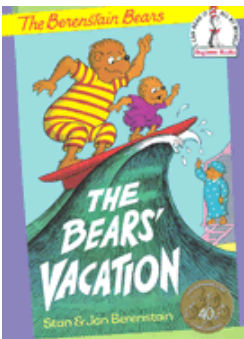
There was an old lady who swallowed Fly Guy

Seven bears sneak out of bed, through the window, and across the dark countryside to investigate the source of a noise.

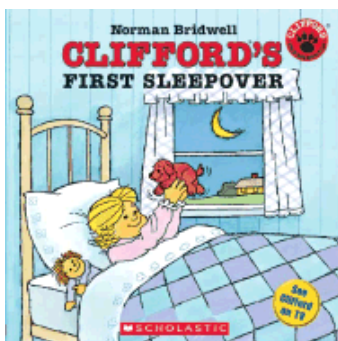


The bears' vacation

by Stan and Jan Berenstain.

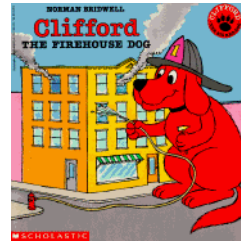
Papa Bear keeps getting into trouble when he tries to show Junior how to ride a bike.

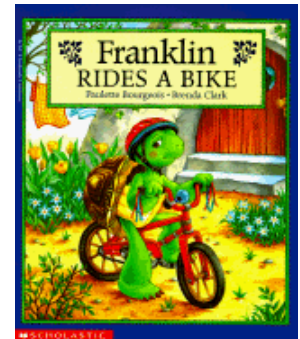


Clifford the firehouse dog

Arthur doesn't believe that his little sister can really read, so he challenges her to prove it.



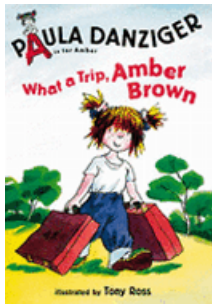
Biscuit wins a prize

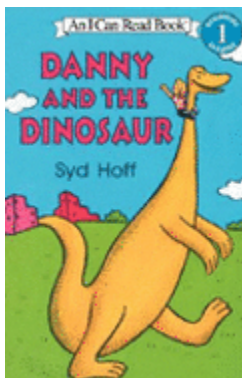
After Mercy the pig snuggles to sleep with the Watsons, all three awaken with the bed teetering on the edge of a big hole in the floor.



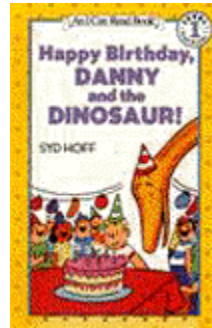
Iris and Walter and Baby Rose

 Six-year-old Danny invites his dinosaur friend to come to his birthday party.

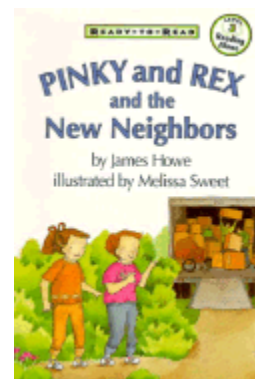
Hot fudge

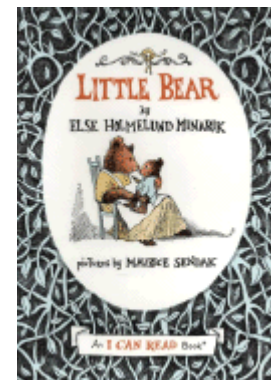

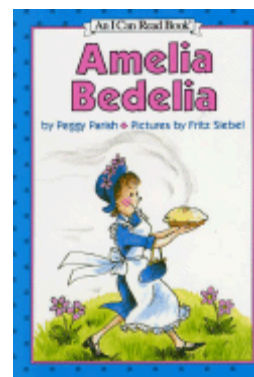

Little Bear's four adventures include taking a trip to the moon and having a birthday party.



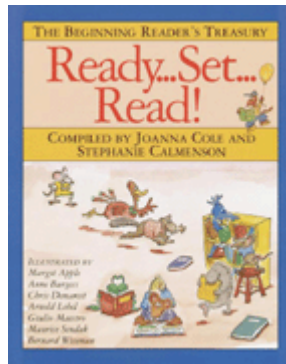

A literal-minded housekeeper causes a ruckus in the household when she attempts to make sense of some instructions.



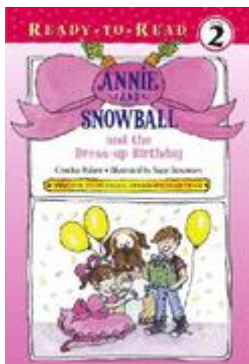

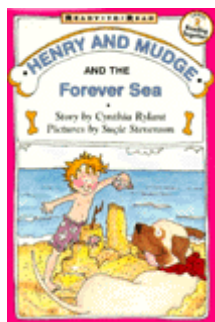

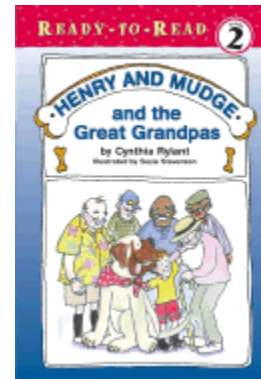


Annie and Snowball and the dress-up birthday : the first book of their adventures

Follows the seaside adventures of Henry, Henry's father, and Henry's big dog Mudge.

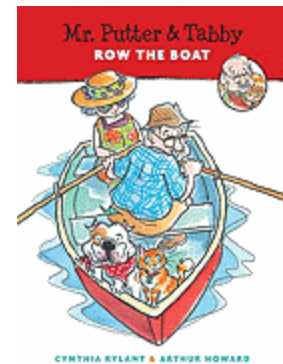


Henry and Mudge and the great grandpas

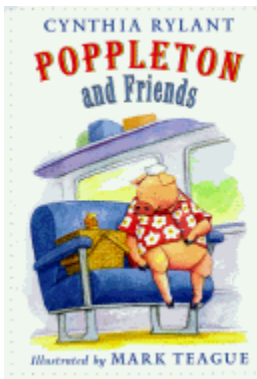


Mr. Putter and Tabby pour the tea

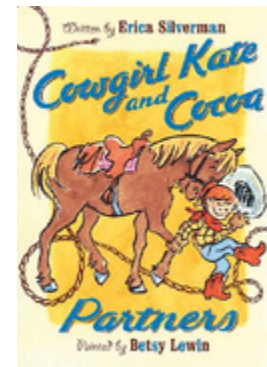


Mr. Putter & Tabby feed the fish

After Mr. Putter buys three goldfish and takes them home, he discovers that his cat Tabby has a serious problem with them.

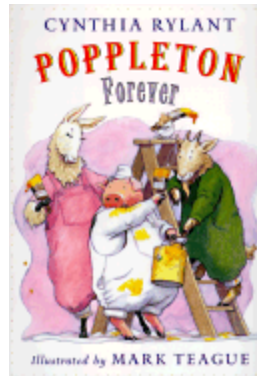


Poppleton and friends

 Cowgirl Kate and her cow horse, Cocoa, discover what it means to work, play, and be together--rain or shine.

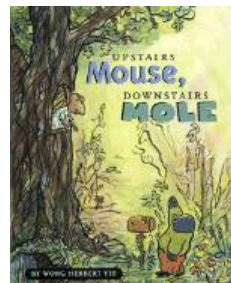


Poppleton has fun.
